



HB 217 (VOTE #396)

AFP Position: SUPPORT

This bill would increase the cap that is currently on the aggregate total of tax exempt dollars that can be donated to scholarships for students to attend private schools. AFP supports expanding school choice for Georgia families and students.

HB 329 (VOTE #145)

AFP Position: SUPPORT

This bill would reduce the income tax rate which will allow families to keep hundreds and possibly thousands of dollars in their paycheck each year. AFP supports lowering taxes on all Georgians.

SB 2 (VOTE #63)

AFP Position: SUPPORT

Government should make it as easy as possible to start and run a business, which is why AFP supports this bill. The FAST Act will require state and local agencies to establish and meet deadlines in issuing permits or licenses; if governments fail to meet these deadlines, applicants will pay reduced fees.

SB 50 (VOTE #68)

AFP Position: SUPPORT

This legislation will allow doctors and patients to engage in direct-pay relationships without involving third payers (insurance). When patients and doctors are free to make these arrangements, patients can experience lower costs and potentially better health outcomes and doctors can spend more time with patients. AFP supports more choice in Georgia's healthcare system.

SB 85 (VOTE #263)

AFP Position: SUPPORT

This bill removes regulatory barriers that hinder malt beverage businesses. AFP supports removing unnecessary government regulation to allow for free markets because that is what is good for small business and for consumers.

HB 125 (VOTE #413)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

This bill gives a sales tax exemption for yacht repairs over \$35,000. AFP opposes tax carve outs for special interests.

HB 155 (VOTE #422)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

This legislation rewards certain businesses in the music industry with taxpayer-funded handouts. Businesses and industries should succeed or fail based on their merits - not on the preferences of politicians. AFP opposes government picking winners and losers in the marketplace.

HB 196 (VOTE #233)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

This bill would have made musicians' royalty income exempt from state income taxes. We don't exempt plumbers, nurses, teachers, or firefighters from paying income taxes. So why should musicians get special treatment?

HB 199 (VOTE #303)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

This bill rewards certain businesses in the video game industry with taxpayer-funded handouts. Businesses and industries should succeed or fail based on their merits - not on the preferences of politicians. AFP opposes government picking winners and losers in the marketplace.

HB 225 (VOTE #224)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

This bill would add an online sales tax as well as a tax on ride sharing companies, making the services and products we buy more expensive. AFP opposes new taxes.

SB 41 (VOTE #332)

AFP Position: OPPOSE

One of the most significant barriers to earning a living that people face across the country is strict occupational licensing laws. Over the past 50 years the number of professions requiring licenses has risen dramatically, from approximately one in twenty workers to one in four workers. These laws force people to undergo thousands of hours of training and spend hundreds, if not thousands, of dollars obtaining these licenses to work. AFP opposes adding new licensure rules to the state code.
